THE SDOH GAP IN CARE

LOUISIANA CHILDREN WHO NEED MENTAL HEALTH CARE CANNOT ACCESS IT. POVERTY, GEOGRAPHY, AND A STRAINED PROVIDER NETWORK LEAVE THE MAJORITY OF AT-RISK YOUTH WITHOUT THE SUPPORT THEY NEED TO THRIVE, MAKING COMMUNITY-BASED MENTORSHIP NOT A LUXURY, BUT A LIFELINE. ALLEVIATING THESE SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH WITHIN OUR COMMUNITIES IS THE FOUNDATION OF DBI'S MISSION.
